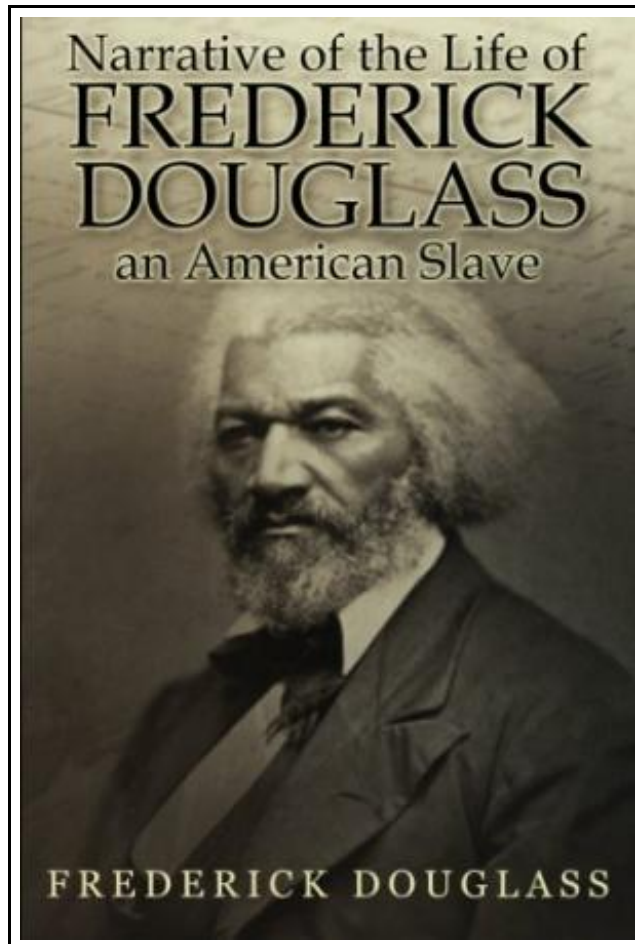

Thompson also was confident that Douglass was not capable of writing the Narrative. He also refuted the Narrative when Douglass described the various cruel white slave holders that he either knew or knew of. While some may believe that Thompson has a valid argument, Douglass use of real dates, names, and places cannot be ignored.
